Polytech Lille Fact Sheet 2025-2026





Polytech Lille is a graduate school of engineering of the University of Lille. Our school offers 8 degree courses in engineering taught in French, organized in 3 academic years after two years of undergraduate studies. The French "Diplôme d'Ingénieur" is recognized as the equivalent of a Master of Science in Engineering in other countries. As a non-degree exchange student, you will study under the same conditions as regular students. You may apply for admission to our engineering degree courses according to the fields defined in the exchange agreement.

An important part of the spring semester is dedicated to the industrial placement or to projects in laboratories (particularly during the fourth and fifth year). • Students who come for the full academic year will combine study period with placements in research laboratories or in industry. **Application** for study period • Nominated students have to fill in **this on-line application form** of the University of Lille. • The application is subject to an academic assessment. Once the application has been officially accepted, a letter of acceptance is issued. The letter of acceptance is suitable for visa request in the home country, when necessary. • Regular workload : 30ECTS credits per semester **Credits requirements** • Minimum expected workload for exchange students : 20ECTS credits per semester

Official transcript of records

A transcript of records will be issued after the end of the assessment period and after the examiners' school board meeting (mid or end of February for the autumn semester and mid-July for the spring semester). It should normally not exceed five weeks after the end of the mobility.

Course Catalog

The fourth and fifth year of studies at Polytech Lille are the equivalent of the first and second year of a master's degree. Exchange students may choose one of the 8 degree courses in engineering and select the modules of one semester (from semester 5 to 10) offered by our school.

Then, they will have to fill in the online learning agreeement (only for one semester even for students applying for the full academic year. A second learning agreement will be done just before the spring semester).

The courses are mainly taught in French, except for the "INSPIRE" program, which is conducted in English. From the web page www.polytech-lille.fr/english/exchange select one degree course in the "Education" section, and then click on "program" to find the list of modules for each of the eight engineering degree courses.

It is recommended not to choose classes from different engineering degree courses or semesters because of incompatible timetables.

Degree courses taught in French:

- Mechanical engineering
- Energy and Industry 4.0
- Internet of Things and Cybersecurity
- Data, Statistics and Software Engineering
- Civil engineering
- Instrumentation and Business Engineering

Program taught in English:

• <u>INSPIRE</u>: INternational semester of Sustainable Practices, Innovation, Resilience and Energy. (Master's level, autumn semester only. Will open only if there are enough students enrolled).

Degree courses not open to exchange students:

- Production Engineering: only for students in continuing education and apprenticeship.
- Geomatics and Urban Engineering: only for students in continuing education and apprenticeship.

Language proficiency

- The language of instruction is French for the degree courses. The minimum required level of French proficiency for exchange students is B1, except for the ones enrolled in the INSPIRE program. We do not require an official French language certificate; an informal assessment from a French professor is sufficient.
- The minimum required level of English proficiency is B1 for students coming for a project supervised in English, or for the INSPIRE program.

French classes

- French classes are offered to exchange students free of charge as part of the curriculum (20 hours each semester) but not for beginner learners.
- Exchange students also have the possibility to attend a fee-paying French summer intensive course. Information available <u>here</u>.

Visa

- European Union nationals only need a valid ID card or passport to live in France.
- Non-European nationals must issue a visa request with the French embassy in their home country and have a passport that is valid for the entire duration of their stay. Processing times can be long. Click here more information about entry formalities

After their arrival, all international students are required to secure a residency permit, with the exception of European Union nationals. This is a dematerialised procedure called <u>ANEF procedure</u>.

When completing the on-line application, exchange students will have to tick "yes" in "further information-accommodation" section if they wish to get a room in a hall of residence.

Then the exchange helpdesk of the University of Lille will contact them to propose a room in a university residence, depending on availabilities and the budget indicated on the application. Please note that the international office cannot guarantee to meet all the requests.

Accomodation

The cheapest rooms are called "CROUS residences".

The monthly rent ranges from 200€ to 350€/month. A deposit payment of up to one month-rent is required.

The <u>Residence Reeflex</u> offers the best facilities for international students but the number of rooms available is limited. It is necessary to indicate "400 €" on the "budget monthly rent" section of the exchange student online application form.

It is not easy to find an accommodation in the city center. It is generally expensive and most owners require a guarantor.

Housing Assistance

International students are eligible to apply for housing assistance as part of a system set up to deal with the relatively high cost of housing in France. The amounts of assistance are based on the rental amount and the student's resources. The benefit is not automatic or provided.

Requests for assistance must be completed on the website of the family assistance fund (CAF: Caisse d'Allocation Familiale) within 3 months of taking possession of your lodgings (more information will be available at the reception desk of the residence).

To be eligible, it is compulsory to open a bank account in France, as housing assistance is deposited directly into the beneficiaries' bank accounts.

Insurances

Civil Liability Insurance (mandatory): Civil liability insurance is required for all registrations in French educational institutions. Student mutual insurers offer cover for damage caused to third parties by the policyholder. It guarantees the repair of damages that may be caused by the student to a third person, material...

Usually, the insurance companies propose a package including all the insurances (civil liability + home insurance + additional health coverage).

Please note that other insurance companies or banks also offer this kind of insurance.

Home Insurance (mandatory): This insurance protects your accommodation in case of fire, water damage, broken glass... Upon arrival, the residence will probably ask the student for a copy of the home insurance. It's better to subscribe online before arrival.

Please note that other insurance companies or banks also offer this kind of insurance.

Social Security insurance (mandatory):

• EEA student (from the European Economic Area):

EEA students do not need to enrol for French student health insurance. They must be in possession of their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) card. This card, provided by the country of origin, gives access to health insurance in France. It must be valid for the entire mobility period.

• Students from outside the EEA:

Mandatory medical cover = French students' social security. Non EU/EEA students must sign up for the French students' social security scheme, it is free of charge.

After their registration at the University of Lille, students will register **here**.

Additional health insurance cover (Highly recommended):

It supplements the reimbursement of medical expenses beyond the amount re-funded by the students' social security scheme or through the EHIC (to almost 100 %). We highly recommend you to suscribe an additional health insurance cover (called « Mutuelle » or « Complémentaire santé » in French). Prices vary depending on the extent of the cover. (minimum: around 12 €/month)

Repatriation insurance (Highly recommended):

It is also recommended to take out a repatriation insurance in your home country before arriving in France.
